Documents Pertaining to the Life of Clara Belle Sproul Jewell Ivancovich, Petaluma Historical Library & Museum. These documents comprise an extensive collection of primary documents donated by Sue Rydberg Canavan in 2014 and 2022 to the Petaluma Historical Library & Museum.

High School Keepsake Album, published by J. B. Lippincott & Company, Philadelphia. This is the personal autograph book owned by Clara Belle Sproul Jewell Ivancovich. The signatures it contains were compiled between 1875 and 1878. Petaluma Historical Library & Museum, accession number 2014-791-23.

Ivancovich, Clara Belle Sproul Jewell, *Beyond the Alps Lies Mine Italy*, 1877. Purported to be Ivancovich's graduating essay from Petaluma High School. Petaluma Historical Library & Museum, accession number 2014-791-23.

Ivancovich, Clara Belle Sproul Jewell, *Diaries*, a set of 10 volumes dating between 1914 and 1939. Petaluma Historical Library & Museum, accession number 2014-791-23. These diaries have been transcribed by Michael Slade, and his transcriptions accompany each diary volume.

Ivancovich, Clara Belle Sproul Jewell, *Discretion*. A one-act play written for the Woman's Club Talent Show of 1927. As of 2022, no copy has been located.

Ivancovich, Clara Belle Sproul Jewell, *Princess Petaluma*. A musical written for the 1923 Petaluma Egg Day and County Fair. As of 2022, no copy has been located.
