This oval-shaped, bust portrait has been dated between the late 1860's and early 1870's. It bears on its reverse side one of Ross's earliest imprints, and although it is an early example of his work, it illustrates his skills as a fine photographer. The soft lighting, demure lowered gaze and intimate, oval crop create a lovely, feminine portrait.

This unidentified, petite, young woman is dressed in a pale gown with slightly dropped shoulders, and her frontbuttoned, fitted bodice is topped with a lace collar. The sitter's narrow, black, ribbon choker is highlighted with a small, gold, bow-shaped brooch, and her elaborate coiffure with its full brow and back curls is restrained at her crown with a dark, shiny bow. Curiously, there is something in her alluring charm and slightly disheveled hair that evoke today's Gothic, Steampunk aesthetic.
